Gross Motor Skills		
My toddler can get from the floor to a standing position without pulling up.		
My toddler walks independently.		
My toddler is beginning to walk up steps independently.		
My toddler tries to get out of confined spaces on her own (e.g., crib).		
My toddler is beginning to run.		
My toddler can kick a ball forward (intentionally or whether he means to or not while chasing it).		
My toddler rides a foot powered ride-on toy.		
My toddler climbs on furniture.		
Fine Motor Skills		
My toddler drinks from a sippy cup, but can drink from an open cup without spilling independently.		
My toddler scribbles on paper with crayons.		
My toddler can copy a circle and an x on paper.		
My toddler can feed herself using a spoon or fork.		
My toddler points to pictures in a book and names at least 4.		
My toddler can stack 3-8 blocks.		
My toddler is beginning to use real objects for alternative purposes and tools (gets a long handle to reach for something under the couch).		
Social/Emotional Skills		
My toddler comes to find me or yells to get attention.		
My toddler hands me a just about anything when I ask for it unless she doesn't want to and may run away or hide the item.		
My toddler is beginning to show a temper more frequently than she used to.		
My toddler recovers after needs are met.		
My toddler brings me things that interest him or that he needs help with.		
My toddler reaches for me and cries when upset.		
My toddler giggles or laughs at funny things.		
My toddler shows excitement when a familiar person interacts with them.		
My toddler shows signs of being OK around strangers if I demonstrate that I'm ok around strangers.

Speech/Language Skills		
My toddler points and tries to say when he wants something.		
My toddler can focus on a book with pictures in it and point to pictures when named.		
My toddler has at least 10 words that I understand.		
My toddler is starting to put 2 words together to get his idea across (e.g., "Go bye-bye." Or "Daddy car.")		
My toddler strings sounds together during play.		
My toddler		
My toddler can follow a one step direction like "Go get the ball."		
My toddler can follow a two step direction like "Go get the ball and bring it to me." (18 months)		
Cognitive Skills		
My toddler wakes from sleep and lets me know he's awake w/o crying.		
My toddler plays and naps on a regular schedule.		
My toddler takes 1-2 naps during the day.		
My toddler wakes no more than 1 time a night.		
My toddler can put a block into a cup and take it out on command.		
My toddler can stack 2-4 blocks, but is more interested in knocking stacks of blocks over.		
My toddler can complete a shape sorting puzzle.		
My toddler actively explores his environment picking up and looking at objects.		
My toddler imitates animal sounds.		
My toddler tries to imitate gestural activities (e.g., Itsy Bitsy Spider).
